THE GETTSYBURG SPLASH! An Evening with Richard M. McMurry

The Cape Fear Civil War Round Table will host at its October 16 meeting one of the leading Civil War historians in America. Richard M. Murry has written and lectured extensively on the Confederate Army of Tennessee. He is the author of John Bell Hood and the War for Southern Independence, the definitive biography of General Hood, and Two Great Rebel Armies, an analysis and comparison of the Army of Northern Virginia and the Army of Tennessee. He is currently working on a history of the Virginia Military Institute.

Dr. McMurry is one of the most sought-after speakers in Civil War circles. His presentations

are lively, entertaining, and provocative.

Richard McMurry, a native of Atlanta, received a B.A. degree in history from the Virginia Military Institute. After serving for two years in the US Army as the Personnel Management Officer at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, he entered graduate school at Emory University in 1963 and received the M.A. degree in 1964 and the Ph.D. in 1967.

Dr. McMurry taught history from 1967-1981 at Valdosta State College. He taught at North Carolina State University from 1981-1989. Since 1989, he has been a freelance writer and speaker and has served as a guide/historian for many tours and cruises. He has authored more than 100 articles on various facets of the Civil War. His two major books, listed above, were listed in 1994 among the 100 best modern Civil War books as selected by the eminent historian, Gary W. Gallagher, for The Magazine Civil War.

Richard McMurry has spoken to Civil War groups, college and university students, historical and library societies, and civic clubs in twenty-four states and the D.C. He is a member of numerous historical societies and is active in such organizations as the Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites and the Blue and Gray Education Society.
