! BATTLEFIELD PRESERVATION ALERT !

From the Civil War Preservation Trust (CWPT) comes this urgent message: The Conservation and Reinvestment Act (CARA) makes good on a promise by Congress 35 years ago to fund the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) which has been the source of millions of battlefield preservation dollars for decades. CARA passed the House with overwhelming bi-partisan support (315-102) in May. CARA will provide for \$15 million annually for battlefield preservation specifically. Yet the bill is now in jeopardy in the Senate, delayed and opposed by several senators from western states. If the Senate fails to take up CARA this fall, the next Congress must start from scratch with a new bill in January.

CWPT urges Civil War buffs to *write a letter* to their Senators indicating support for the Senate version of the bill with its \$15 million for the battlefields before the October adjournment. Send to The Honorable —, United States Senate, Washington DC 20510.
